

ADTA Letter to Address Unjust Policing

Dear ADTA Community:

Black Lives Matter. Systemic racism persists. Change is needed now.

The leadership of the American Dance Therapy Association (ADTA) seeks to add our voices and our actions to combat racism at all institutional levels, starting with our own. In addition, we invite our community to take action on local, state, and federal levels. In response to the murder of Mr. George Floyd, Rayshard Brooks, and countless others, the spotlight has, again, been turned on racialized police violence and racial disparities in the justice system. Steps are currently being proposed at multiple levels of law enforcement to stop brutal police practices that stem from racism and a place of white supremacy, but they are not enough. As community and mental health professionals, we demand the inclusion of public health perspectives which acknowledge that structural racism must be addressed in creating safer communities.

Join us in calling on our elected officials to acknowledge the need for trauma-informed policing practices, with the clear understanding that racism is a violent act and law enforcement must respond with an awareness of racial trauma.
